



A Dog's Way Home by W. Bruce Cameron

The Woman in the Window by A.J. Finn


An agoraphobic New Yorker spends her time watching her neighbors until she sees more than she

The Goldfinch by Donna Tartt


After his mother is killed during a bombing, a young boy is given a home by a wealthy Upper East Side family.
