
A Regional Destination to Live, Work, and Play

Mount Vernon is located along the I-5 corridor, 60 miles north of Seattle and 80 miles south of Vancouver, British Columbia. Mount Vernon is unique as it is one of the only cities west of the Mississippi and north of San Francisco that within a 100 mile radius can draw from an estimated 6 million people. It is a great destination for shopping, dining, recreation, and business.

Population Growth

Mount Vernon has grown by 15% in the last 10 years and is expected to increase its population nearly 70% by 2025. This is more than double that of Washington State, and greater even than the National rate average of 13%. Mount Vernon has absorbed a significant spill-over from the Seattle/Everett metropolitan area. People have been calling Mount Vernon their home because they prefer the affordable housing and quality of life that Mount Vernon offers.
