City of Mount Vernon Extends Executive Orders to May 4

April 3, 2020

MOUNT VERNON—Mayor Boudreau has issued a new executive order which will extend all previous city executive orders to May 4th.

The order simply aligns three existing directives with Governor Inslee's recently extended stay-at-home timeline.

Among those extended city orders is the Mayor's permission for currently operating temporary homeless shelters to remain open beyond the expiration of their permits.

Other orders include closing city office locations to the public. The City continues to staff essential personnel at locations such as city hall, parks and recreation offices, and public works offices; and city services remain available to the public, by telephone, and by written or electronic correspondence.

The Mount Vernon Library is also closed to the public, as well as some park facilities such as playground equipment. Playfields are closed to regularly scheduled games and practices.

Trails at locations such as Little Mountain are currently open, and will remain open for as long as social distancing practices are observed.
