




Native plants are those that occur naturally in a region in which they evolved. They are the ecological basis upon which life depends, including birds and people. Without them and the insects that co-evolved with them, local birds cannot survive.

Resilient plants are those that require less water and maintenance, fight disease, and are resistant to animals like deer.

Native and resilient plants used in the Mount Vernon Library Commons were selected to be low maintenance and provide seasonal variety in color and texture. They are beneficial for pollinators, birds, animals and humans.




